I am very excited for this school year. We will travel around the world reading stories that exhume various cultures through their own perspectives. Students are expected to master the NC standards for 10th grade reading and writing literature and informational texts. We will do this through the study of World Literature set out by the Cumberland County Schools pacing guides. This course will also prepare you for your EOC through metacognitive instruction through reading comprehension guides and bi-monthly quizzes (SMA's)

**Students will be taking the English 2 End of Course Test which is 20% of the total grade. The length of time for the test is three hours with up to four hours without accommodations.

Test Specifications

- seven passages (1 poem, 4 informational, 2 fictional)
- Average passage length of five pages
- 55 multiple choice, 4 constructed response, and 5 technology enhanced questions
- Completely online
- Some of the multiple choice questions are discrete items (meaning they do not directly relate to the text)

For the Reading for Literature and Information, students will be reading passages from literature, poems, and articles about various topics. They will answer multiple choice questions and constructed response questions (short answer) about these different passages. There are a total of 68 items on the test.
